Mitigation Best Practices training concentrates on science, methods, and tools to engage communities/residents, eliminate ineffective but common practices, and get community fire adaptation actions accomplished on the ground. This national level 2-day training is for current or future mitigation specialists, wildfire program leads and others who work with communities/residents to get mitigation done and focuses on federal, state, county, community, and non-profit practitioners.

Community Mitigation Assistance Team training focuses on how CMAT works with communities and what skills and experience are needed to participate on a national CMAT. This training is part of the continuing development and implementation of the CMAT concept and focuses on potential CMAT trainees and team members from federal, state, county, community, and non-profit jurisdictions. All CMAT participants must take Mitigation Best Practices Training.
